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

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

Older people know best what they need, so they must be at the center of any effort to create a more age-friendly world.





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

Age-Friendly Communities provide safe, walkable streets; housing and transportation options; access to needed support services; and opportunities for all ages to participate in community life.








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

Our **first** aim is to reach 20% by December 31, 2020: 1000 hospitals and 1000 primary care practices






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The 4Ms Framework



- Builds on very strong evidence
- Represents core health issues that matter to older adults
- Simplifies & reduces implementation and measurement burden while increasing effectiveness
- Components are synergistic and reinforce one another
- Has an impact on key quality and safety outcomes







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

- What Matters
- Medication
- Mentation
- Mobility

Assure Acting On the 4Ms:

- Assure Workforce Competent in Age-Friendly Care
- Link to Health Systems and Area Agencies on Aging addressing Age-Friendly Care
- Evaluate 4Ms Goal of Primary & Secondary Prevention of 4Ms



Assess Acting On the 4Ms:

- What Matters/Advance Care Planning
- Medication Management
- Maintain Cognitive Wellness/ Address Social Isolation
- Mobility/Fall Risk

Policy to support Acting on the 4Ms:

- Empower older adults and caregivers to demand Age-Friendly care
- Engage older adults and caregivers in actions that support their health
- Develop policies to promote Age-Friendly care and embed 4Ms








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Advancing an Age-Friendly Social Movement







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Age-Friendly = Vision-Friendly

Policy Action

- Implement public health vision screening programs in senior centers and other settings with older adults
- Review and potentially expand Medicare coverage of vision services and low vision devices
- Include vision-related measures in national surveillance surveys

Community Action – Support Programs to:

- Increase access to screenings, eyeglasses, etc. (e.g., libraries having reading aids)
- Make home environments more visionaccessible (structured environments, lighting)
- Assist people with low vision through technology, volunteer programs, etc.
