# **IMPETUS**

#### **Outreach grant making**

Difficult to measure impact (with some exceptions)

- Connecting at-risk people with eye care services, especially adults, working only on limited basis
- Supporting pockets of success
- Not moving the needle toward lasting change
- Not developing systems to close the gaps, particularly for adults
