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Challenges in the Healthcare System



Lower insurance coverage and unmet healthcare needs among visually impaired individuals.

Statistical Insights

- 7% of visually impaired adults lacked health insurance coverage
- 4% of visually impaired adults did not have a usual healthcare provider
- 29.2% of visually impaired adults had unmet healthcare needs due to cost barriers



Challenges in the Healthcare System

Daily Challenges

- Inaccessible medical forms, lack of braille signage.
- Attitudinal barriers and misconceptions about capabilities.





Advocacy and Solutions



Seeing visual impairment as a different way of navigating the world.

Practical Solutions

- Educate Yourself: Learn about challenges and resources.
- Speak Up: Advocate for accessibility and against discrimination.
- Support Advocacy Organizations: Donate or volunteer.
- Champion Inclusive Design: Prioritize accessibility in healthcare products/services.
- Foster Empathy: Listen to and share experiences of visually impaired individuals.



Empowering Change



Individual Advocacy

- Know your rights, communicate needs, request accessible formats.
- Bring support to appointments, file complaints if necessary.

Systemic Advocacy

- Support from organizations like AFB and NFB.
- Recent legislative efforts and the role of inclusive design.
