





As we reflect on 2024, we are filled with gratitude and pride for the milestones achieved in our shared mission to prevent blindness and preserve sight. This year we have made significant strides in raising awareness about eye and vision health and advocating for improved access to eye care across the nation.

Among the highlights of 2024 was our nationwide campaign to educate the public about eye safety for one of the year's biggest cultural events, the April 8, 2024, total solar eclipse that crossed the United States from the Southwest to Northeast, visible to almost everyone in the country. Through media outreach, social media campaigns, educational

videos and web content, school programs, and viewing events, we helped ensure that millions of Americans enjoyed this celestial event without risking their vision.

Our annual **Focus on Eye Health Summit** brought together experts, policymakers, and advocates to explore innovative solutions to prevent blindness and vision loss. "Being Seen and Heard," the theme of our 13th summit, emphasized the importance of a person-centered approach to health.

The Prevent Blindness **ASPECT Patient Engagement Program** also continues to amplify the voices of individuals with vision challenges, fostering a more inclusive approach to vision care. ASPECT patients educated legislators in Washington, D.C., as part of our 19th annual **Eyes on Capitol Hill** advocacy event, presented at our Focus on Eye Health Summit as well as in educational webinars and other outreach events throughout the year, adding vital patient perspectives to state and national conversations about eye care, accessibility and mental wellness.

These efforts supported our outreach to adults with vision screening programs conducted by Prevent Blindness affiliates who also helped connect patients to needed eye care. Live educational programs and online webinars provided awareness and education about age-related eye diseases such as MacTel Type 2 and Glaucoma to patients and professionals.

Astrophotographer Jon Carmichael hosted an educational video about safely recording a solar eclipse.

Prevent Blindness worked toward a successful introduction of the "Early Detection of Vision Impairments for Children (EDVI)

Act," in the 118th Congress.

The bipartisan EDVI Act seeks to establish grants for states and communities to improve children's vision and eye health through coordinated systems of care. It was co-sponsored by Congressional Vision Caucus (CVC) co-chairs, U.S. Representative Gus Bilirakis (FL-12), and U.S. Representative Marc Veasey (TX-33). We will continue our work in 2025 to support the EDVI Act in the new Congress.

The Prevent Blindness Children's Vision Health Map at PreventBlindness.org is the first interactive tool of its kind, providing a geospatial overview of children's vision problems in the U.S.

Under the leadership of the National Center for Children's Vision and Eye Health at Prevent Blindness (NCCVEH) and with the partnership of our affiliates around the country we trained and certified school nurses, pediatrician clinic staff and volunteers to conduct children screening programs and provide follow-up services to help connect families with eye doctors, helping those in need access free eyecare and glasses. Our educational webinars reached diverse communities of patients and healthcare professionals, providing vital information on preserving eye health for children.

The 2024 **Person of Vision Gala** reached new heights for attendance and financial support, raising funds needed for our mission among the professional community attending Vision Expo East. This year's memorable occasion celebrated the leadership of Ed Buffington, President and CEO of GPN Technologies, and his dedication to advancing eye health. This year Ed extended that leadership to our efforts by joining the Prevent Blindness Board of Directors and Development Committee.

These accomplishments would not have been possible without your generous contributions. Thanks to you, our individual donors, our corporate sponsors and foundation supporters, we continue to alter the course of individual lives every day as we advance our sight-saving mission throughout the year. Looking ahead to 2025, we remain steadfast in our commitment to building a world where preventable blindness is no longer a barrier to a life well-lived. Together, we can continue to protect the precious gift of sight.
